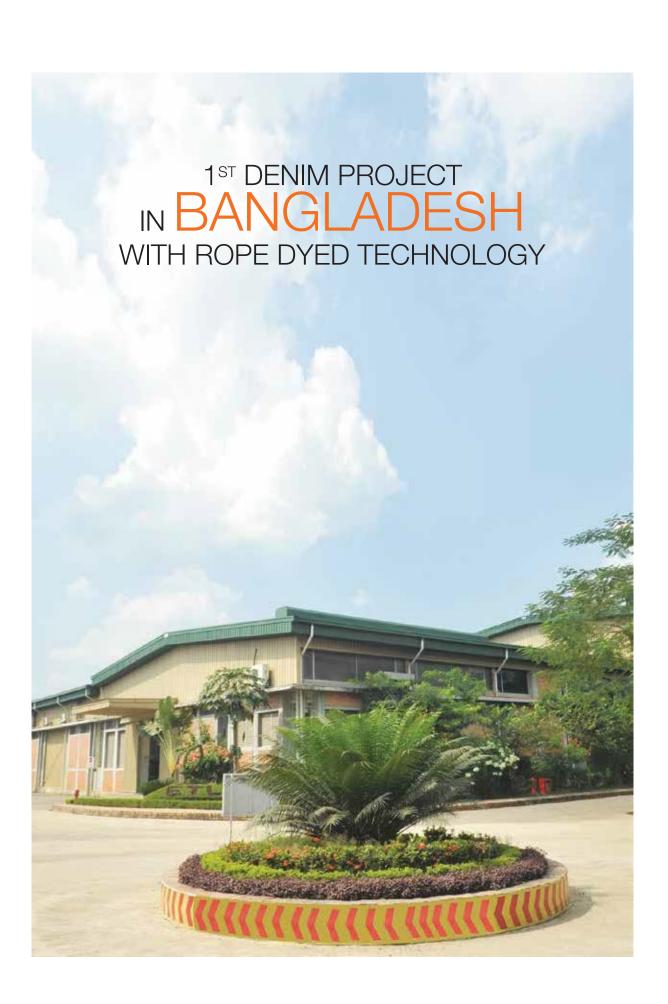

EXPLANATORY NOTES TO THE AGENDA FOR THE 19th ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF SHAREHOLDERS OF ENVOY TEXTILES LTD

Agenda No. 1: To receive, consider and adopt the Financial Statements of the Company for the year ended 30 September 2014 together with the Reports of the Directors' and the Auditors' thereon.

The Annual Report for 2014 contains the Annual Accounts for the year ended 30 September 2014 together with the Report of the Auditors' thereon and the report from the Board of Directors.

The Annual Accounts for the financial year 2013-2014 have been executed by the members of the Board and duly approved by the Audit Committee. The Financial Statement properly reviewed by CEO and CFO of the Company prior to submit the Audit Committee. MABS & J Partners, the Company's external Auditors, has issued an unqualified audit opinion, which is included in the Annual Accounts for the financial year 2013-2014.

Pursuant to the section 184 &183 of the Companies Act, 1994, the directors are required to present to the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting the Directors' Report and Annual Audited Financial Statements including Auditors Report thereon.

It is proposed to adopt the Annual Accounts for the financial year 2013-2014 together with the Report of the Directors' and the Auditors' thereon.

Agenda No. 2: To declare dividend for the year ended 30 September 2014.

Net income attributable to Shareholders amounted to Taka 310.925 million, Earnings per Share (EPS) consequently amounted to Taka 2.21 in Financial Year 2013-2014. In light of ETL's dividend policy, the Board of Directors, with the approval of the Audit Committee, recommended in its Meeting held on Wednesday, 19 November 2014 12% cash dividend (i.e. Taka 1.20 for every share of Tk.10.00 each) and 3% Stock Dividend (i.e. 3 shares for every 100 ordinary shares held) for the year ended 30 September 2014 to the General Meeting of Shareholders to be held on 24 December 2014. The record date is 2 December 2014. The payment of the dividend will be within 22 January 2015 as per BSEC notification No. SEC/CMRRCD/2009-193/18/Admin/dated 09 February 2010 and those shareholders are entitled for dividend whose names would appear in the depository register of CDBL on the record date.

Members are requested to submit to the Company's Registered/Corporate Office on or before 30 December 2014, their written option to receive dividend. In case of non-submission of such option within the stipulated time, the dividend will be paid as deemed appropriate by the Company.

Agenda No. 3: To elect Directors in accordance with the provision of Articles of Association of the Company.

In accordance with Article No. 125 and 126 of the Articles of Association of Envoy Textiles Limited, Mr. Kutubuddin Ahmed, Director and Chairman of the Company and Mrs. Sharmin Salam, Director of the Company to be retired from their office and being eligible, offered themselves for re-election.

As the Board of Directors greatly value Mr. Kutubuddin Ahmed and Mrs. Sharmin Salam's contribution to the development of ETL and their commitment shown in their responsibilities as the members of the Board, it is proposed to re-appoint Mr. Kutubuddin Ahmed and Mrs. Sharmin Salam as members of the Board of the Company for a period until retired by rotation as per section 91 of the Companies Act, 1994 and relevant provisions of the Articles of Association of the Company.

Agenda No. 4: To appoint Auditors of the Company for the term until the completion of next Annual General Meeting and fixation of their remuneration.

M/S MABS & J Partners, Chartered Accountants has carried out the audit of the Company from the year 2012-2013 and completed second consecutive year of audit, being they are eligible and willing to continue. In recommendation of the Audit committee, the Board in its Meeting held on Wednesday, 19 November 2014 proposed for reappointment of M/S MABS & J Partners, Chartered Accounts at an increased remuneration to hold office for the period until conclusion of the next 20th Annual General Meeting of the Company.



It is proposed to reappoint M/S MABS & J Partners of address, in compliance with the section 210 of the Companies Act, 1994 & BSEC Notification No. SEC/CMRRCD/2009-193/104/Admin/ dated 27 July 2011, as the external auditor of the Company charged with the auditing of the Annual Accounts for the financial year 2014-2015 at an increased remuneration.

Agenda No. 5: To pass special resolution in order to increase the Authorized Capital of the Company from Taka 275 crore to Taka 400 crore and to amend the Clause E and Article No. 6 of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Company respectively.

The following resolution will be placed before the 19th Annual General Meeting to consider and, if thought fit, to pass with or without modification, as a special resolution:

Resolved that the Authorized Share Capital of the Company be increased from Taka 275,00,00,000 (Two Hundred Seventy Five Crore) only divided into 27,50,00,000 (Twenty Seven Crore Fifty Lac) shares, comprising of 15,00,00,000 (Fifteen Crore) Ordinary Shares of Taka 10 (Ten) each and 12,50,00,000 (Twelve Crore Fifty Lac) Preference Shares of Taka 10(Ten) each to Taka 400,00,00,000 (Four Hundred Crore) only divided into 40,00,00,000 (Forty Crore) shares, comprising of 27,50,00,000 (Twenty Seven Crore Fifty Lac) Ordinary Shares of Taka 10 (Ten) each and 12,50,00,000 (Twelve Crore Fifty Lac) Preference Shares of Taka 10 (Ten) each.

Further Resolved that necessary amendments be made in the Clause E of Memorandum and Article No. 6 of Articles of Association of the Company to confirm to and adopt the same as per the above resolution

Incorporated as a Private Limited Company in 1995, before being converted into a Public Limited Company in 2009, Envoy Textiles Limited – a manufacturer of 100% export-oriented denim fabric, is the 1st denim project in Bangladesh with rope-dyed technology and one of the country's leading companies in this sector.

Envoy Textiles Limited went into commercial operations in 2008 and got an associate company- Edge Denims Limited amalgamated with it in 2009, designed for setting off a new era of excellence in management, cost control, and avoidance of complications in business dealings and operations. In June 2012, the company obtained consent, from the Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission, for raising funds through Initial Public Offerings (IPO) and thus got listed with DSE and CSE at the end of same year.

The factory of ETL is located in Jamirdia, Bhaluka, Mymensingh, around 71 km North from Dhaka City. The total land area, registered in the name of the company, is around of 117.12 Bigha. The layout plan is so beautifully designed as to produce a very scenic and eye-catching landscape all around.

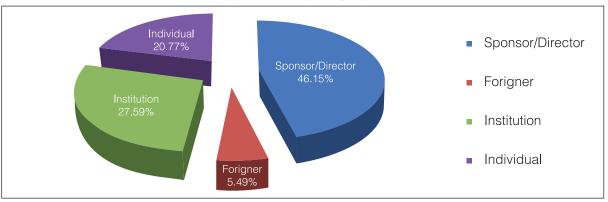

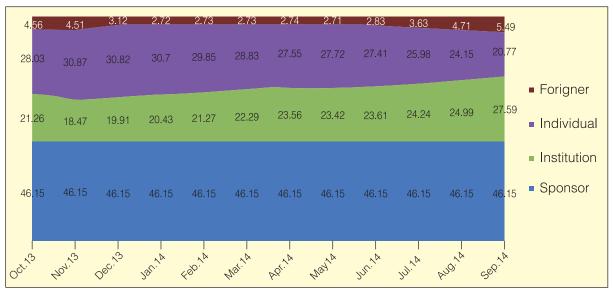

PERFORMANCE





Chairman's Report

Dear Shareholders:

I, on behalf of the Board of Directors take great pleasure to extend a warm welcome to you all at the 19th Annual General Meeting of Envoy Textiles Limited. It is with my utmost pleasure that I present before you the Annual Report of the Company for the year 2014.

In spite of many challenges from the external environment and competition, your company achieved desirable growth in turnover which delivered reasonable business results in 2014

The Company producing a range of high quality denim fabrics featuring a wide range of yarns and weaves in various shades, is the leading exporter of denim fabrics in Bangladesh, exporting to more than fourteen countries on top of deemed exporting through local RMG.

With consistent growth in turnover over the past year, the Company increased its gross turnover to Taka 4,391.17 Million. The decline in profitability of the Company was mostly reason due to the downward trend of selling price and demand caused by political instability and increasing cost of overheads due to capacity under utilization.

The company's revenue grew at a faster pace in the last two quarters compared to the first two quarters due to the recent stability of the country's political situation.

In FY 2013-2014, despite lots of prevailing external uncertainties in the country, we sustained our business with minimal disruption.

The key performance highlights of 2013-14 include:

- An increase in the Company revenue by 10.23% from 2012-2013
- Attaining the highest ever sales volume by increasing production by 15.94%
- A true increase in Net Asset Value per Share by .73%, compare to restated NAV of the previous year

As backward linkage, we are going to set up a Spinning unit for yarn manufacturing, within the compound of the Company's existing denim factory plant having an annual production capacity of 17,500 Ton. The total estimated project cost is USD 30 Million, and the major capital machineries, being imported for setting up the project are primarily from Germany, Switzerland and Japan in origin. The project is expected to come in commercial operation by 1st quarter of 2016.

The production of yarn will mostly be used for the Company's own consumption and may be increased approximately at a yearly profit of BDT 40-45 crore from the expected turnover of USD 50 Million p.a. on completion of implementation of the spinning unit.

We feel proud of our sustainable business continuity planning, which include:

- An expansion in production capacity
- Plan to set up backward linkage for uninterrupted raw material supply,
- Investment behind human resource
- Development of R&D for quality output
- Focus on environmental health
- Ensure safety at our workplace and
- Have a pleasant working environment for the employees by offering them various amenities.

The flow of work orders has however, declined recently due to prolonged political unrest and sluggish economic activities that had occurred during the past few months, the industry is struggling to keep up with the high volume of orders as international buyers are shifting orders from other countries like China to Bangladesh for price competitiveness.

Denim produced in Bangladesh is attracting a larger global market since its consumption is spreading worldwide.

You are fully aware that maintaining proper environment and ecological balance is very important for a healthy society, habitat and national development. We are equally concerned, and have been persistently pursuing the principle of maintaining appropriate environment, reducing environmental pollution and established a zero-tolerance policy in order to make sure that we become environment promoters, not destroyers. This principle and policy is strongly manifested through the installation of ETP, rainwater-harvesting provisions, man-made lake created inside the factory complex. We strongly believe that, a healthy society can bring out the best in people.

The management of the Company has been very dynamic to meet adverse situation effectively during the period of political turmoil and performed very well in an optimistic manner to produce an acceptable result.

On behalf of the Board of Directors and on my personal behalf, I would like to thank all our Shareholders and members of the Board for their unstinted support. I thankfully acknowledge the support and guidance from the regulatory bodies. I wish to place on record my appreciation to the employees for their commitment, dedication and hard work.

Lastly, and most importantly, I acknowledge with gratitude, the sincere support and trust of the buyers and financing partners who constitute the strength of the Company and who are our source of inspiration. We look towards the future with the confidence of running the business optimally, maximizing the returns to our stakeholders.

We hope that with your continuous support the Company shall be able to carry on its journey to progress in the years ahead.

Board of Directors

Composition

The Board of ETL considers that its membership should comprise of directors with an appropriate mix of skills, experience and personal attributes that allow the directors, individually and the Board, collectively, to discharge their responsibilities and duties, under the law, efficiently and effectively, understand the business of the Company and assess the performance of the management.

The composition of the Board embraces diversity. The Directors have a range of local and international experience and expertise, and specialized skills to assist with decision making and leading the company for the benefit of shareholders.

The Board of ETL comprises of Eight Directors, including two Independent Directors who possess a wide range of skills and experience over a range of professions and businesses. Each of ETL's directors brings in independent judgment and considerable knowledge to perform their roles effectively. The Board of Directors ensures that the activities of the Company are always conducted with adherence to strict and highest possible ethical standards and in the best interests of the stakeholders.

Retirement and Re-election of Directors

As per the Article of Association of the company, at least one-third of the directors are to retire every year and they shall be those who have been longest in the office since their last election. But as for individuals who had been appointed as directors on the same day, their retirement shall (unless they otherwise agree themselves) be determined by lot, but they will remain eligible for re-election.

Independent Director

Mr. Abul Kalam Azad, FCA was appointed by the Board of ETL on 5 December 2012 as Independent Director, duly approved by the Shareholders at 17th Annual General Meeting held on 31 December 2012 and after that the Board has also appointed to Mr. Sk. Bashir Ahmed, B.Sc. Engg. MIE (B) as an Independent Director on 14 May 2013, accordingly approved by the Shareholders at 18th Annual General Meeting held on 20 December 2013 for the first three years term in compliance with the Provision 1.2(i)&(iii) of BSEC Notification relating Corporate Governance dated August 7, 2012.



Mr. Azad is a fellow member of ICAB, possessing 35 years of professional experience and Mr. Ahmed is a graduate Civil Engineer from BUET, having 21 years of business experience. Both of the Independent Directors hold no shares in the Company.

Role and Responsibilities of the Board

The Board is committed to the Company seeking to achieve superior financial performance and long term prosperity, while meeting stakeholders' expectations of sound corporate governance practices. The Board of Directors is in full control of the Company's affairs and is also fully accountable to the shareholders.

They firmly believe that the success of the Company largely depends on the credible corporate governance practices adopted by the Company. Taking this into consideration, the Board of Directors of ETL set out its strategic focus and look over the business and related affairs of the Company. The Board also formulates the strategic objectives and policy framework for the Company.

Chairman of the Board

The Chairman of the Board is elected to the office of Chairman by the directors. The Board considers that the Chairman is independent.

Role of the Chairman

The Chairman runs the Board. The Chairman serves as the primary link between the Board and management, and works with the Managing Director and Company Secretary to set the agenda for Board meetings. It is the Chairman's responsibility to provide leadership to the Board and ensure that the Board works effectively and discharges its responsibilities as directors of the Company.

Chairman of the Board & Managing Director of the Company are different person

The Chairman of the Board is not the Chief Executive of the Company. The role of Chairman and the Managing Director are independent and separate.

Role of the CEO

The CEO is responsible for establishing and executing the Company's operating plan that is necessary to achieve the Company's objectives; as a coach, the CEO works with executives to help them become greater contributors by helping them improve their efficiency and effectiveness.

Conduct for the Board Members

The Board of Directors of ETL is committed to the highest standards of conduct in their relationships with its employees, buyers, members, shareholders, regulators and the public.

Board Meeting

Holding of the Board Meeting

The Meetings of the Board of Directors of ETL are normally held at the Registered/Corporate Office of the Company. The meetings are held frequently, at least once in a quarter, to discharge its responsibilities and functions as mentioned above. The Meeting is scheduled well in advance and the notice of each Board meeting is given, in writing, to each director by the Company Secretary.

Number of Board meeting held in 2013-14 (01 October 2013 to 30 September 2014)

The number of meetings of the Board held during the accounting year, and the attendance of directors at those meetings are disclosed in the Annexure-III of the Directors' Report.

The number of directors required to constitute a quorum is three (3), out of the eight directors. During the period, total fifteen (15) Board meetings were held.



Role of the Company Secretary

Appointed by the Board, the Company Secretary works with the Chairman of the Board to monitor and enhance corporate governance processes and to ensure that Board policies and procedures are tracked.

Senior Executive

Structure

The Company's management structure comprises by the CEO and the Head of the divisions. The Management Team (MT) is responsible for developing organizational and business strategy and sponsoring innovation and development of best practices across the company. The MT is also responsible for organizational effectiveness and the development of ETL's values and culture. The MT is responsible for managing ETL's performance and key business issues in line with the company's long term strategy and for talent and performance management. The MT is chaired by the CEO and the team meets face to face on a regular basis.

Performance Review

The CEO is responsible for setting financial targets as well as operational and management goals for the members of the MT. Both short term and long term goals form part of the performance management of all senior executives. Long term goals are directly linked to the vision of the company. Short term goals are generally directly linked to objectives of the company.

The Chairman and CEO conduct a detailed review of the performance of senior executives against these goals on quarterly basis.

Remuneration of the senior executives

Remuneration of all senior executives, are based on performance review appraisal measuring through quarterly and annual KPI (Key Performance Indicator) appraisal system.

Board Committee

The Board has established a permanent Board Committee to assist advice and make recommendations to the Board on matters falling within their respective responsibilities.

Audit Committee

The ETL Audit Committee is a sub-committee of the Board of Directors of Envoy Textiles Limited formed in compliance with BSEC Corporate Governance notification dated August 7, 2012 and international best practices on Corporate Governance.

Objectives of the Audit Committee

The principal function of the Audit Committee is to exercise and have an oversight over the Company's risk management, financial reporting and regulatory compliance functions.

Composition of Audit Committee including independent Director

An audit committee consisting of the Independent Director as Chairman and two other Directors as member has been constituted in terms of the BSEC guidelines for ensuring good governance practices. The audit committee of the Board had held 4 (four) Meetings during the year and examined the coverage of internal and external audit.

The Company Secretary acts as the secretary of the Audit Committee.

Chairman of the Audit Committee and his qualifications

The Committee is headed by Mr. Abul Kalam Azad, FCA with thirty five years' of knowledge and experience in the fields of accounting, finance, audit and corporate management. Mr. Azad is a fellow member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Bangladesh (ICAB).



The Audit Committee and Internal Audit

Internal Audit is the division within ETL that is responsible for reviewing the company's system of internal controls, including the conduct of regular audits of all operational units. Internal Audit is operationally independent and its members are not involved in the company's operational activities and in that the Head of Internal Audit, in addition to his direct reporting line to the Chairman & CEO, also has access to the Audit Committee.

The Audit Committee is responsible for approving the annual audit plan of Internal Audit Division and reviewing the plan's subsequent implementation. Internal audit reports or summaries thereof prepared by Internal Audit Division are reviewed on a regular basis by the committee.

Reporting of Audit Committee

The Audit Committee reports directly to the Board of Directors and under certain circumstances can also report to the Chairman.

Internal Control

Internal control is a process designed to provide reasonable assurance regarding the achievement of objectives relating to effectiveness and efficiency of operations, reliability of both external and internal financial and non financial reporting, and compliance with applicable laws and regulations in ETL. The control system applies to all divisions and departments of ETL's operations.

Communications and Relationship with Shareholders

ETL strongly believes that all stakeholders should have access to complete information on its activities, performance and product initiatives. The Company's web site www.envoytextiles.com displays, inter alia, the annual report, half yearly report, quarterly report, product offerings, recent announcements and event updates.

The Company reports to the shareholders, four times a year, through quarterly, half yearly report and detailed annual report. Every shareholder has the right to attend the annual general meeting, where they can meet and communicate with the directors and express their views regarding the Company's business, its future prospects and other matters of interest. The shareholders are always encouraged to attend the meeting or, if unable to attend, may appoint proxies.

All disclosures required by the Company Act, 1994, Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission, Listing Regulations of Dhaka Stock Exchange Limited and Chittagong Stock Exchange Limited are made adequately and promptly.

Preparation and Presentation of Financial Statements and Directors' Responsibility

The Companies Act 1994 requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each accounting year. The Board of Directors accept the responsibility of preparing the financial statements, maintaining adequate records for safeguarding the assets of the Company, preventing and detecting fraud and/or other irregularities, selecting suitable accounting policies and apply those policies, consistently, and making reasonable and prudent judgments and estimates where necessary.



Report of the Audit Committee

The Audit Committee oversees the Company's financial reporting process on behalf of the Board of Directors. The Company's management has the primary responsibility for the financial statements, for maintaining effective internal control over financial reporting, and for assessing the effectiveness of internal control over financial reporting. In fulfilling its oversight responsibilities, the Committee reviewed and discussed the financial statements and the related schedules with Company management, including a discussion of the quality, not just the acceptability, of the accounting principles; the balance between judgments; and the clarity of disclosures in the financial statements.

The Committee discussed with the Company's internal auditors and statutory auditors the overall scope and plans for their respective audits. The Committee meets with the internal auditors and the external audit firm, with or without the presence of the management, to discuss the results of their examinations; their evaluation of the Company's internal control and the overall quality of the Company's financial reporting.

In reliance on the reviews and discussions referred to above, the Committee recommended to the Board of Directors, that the financial statements and related schedules be included in the Annual Report to which the Board has approved,

The Committee is governed by a term of reference in line with requirements of BSEC notification on corporate governance. The Committee held four meetings during the fiscal year 2013-14. The Committee is comprised of three directors including an independent director, who is the Chairman of the Committee as defined by the Bangladesh Securities and Exchange Commission Corporate governance guideline Notification.

During the year 2013-14, the Audit Committee carried out the following activities:

1. Financial Reporting

Reviewed the quarterly, half-yearly and annual financial statement of the Company with the Chief Financial Officer and Chief Executive Officer, focusing particularly on significant changes to accounting policies and practices, adjustments arising from the audits, in compliance with the accounting standards and other legal requirements before recommending it to the Board for approval.

- 2. Internal Control and Internal Audit system
 - a. Reviewed Internal Control and Internal Audit system periodically.
 - b. Reviewed status reports of internal audit to ensure that appropriate actions had been taken to implement the audit recommendations
- 3. External audit

Reviewed with the external auditors, the Company's annual financial statements were discussed with the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer, focusing on findings arising from audits, before recommending it to the Board of Directors for approval.

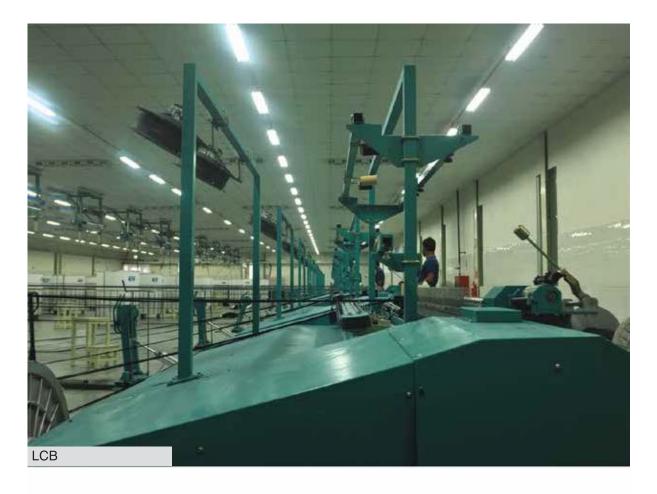

DIRECTORS' REPORT



Directors' Report to the Shareholders

Dear Shareholders:

In terms of provision of Section 184 of the Companies Act 1994, Rule 12 (and the schedule thereunder) of the Securities and Exchange Rules 1987 and Bangladesh Securities & Exchange Commission Notification, no.SEC/CMRRCD/2006 158/134/Admin/44 dated 7 August 2012 on compliance of corporate governance guidelines, it is the pleasure of the Board of Directors to submit its Report to the Shareholders for the year ended 30 September 2014 in the following paragraphs:

Industry Outlook

Textiles have been an extremely important part of Bangladesh's economy for a very long time as the industry holds 15 percent share of GDP, providing huge employment to the country, and contributing 5% of the total national income.

Bangladesh, the top 4th denim fabric producer in the world, produces 30 million yards of denim a month, and has at least 25 factories around the country. Bangladesh is the second largest denim-made garments exporter after China, the country exports denim fabrics and denim-made garments worth more than \$1200 million a year.

The quality of the denim fabric produced has been improved significantly and its price competitiveness, leading to a great increase in the demand for Bangladeshi denim fabrics in both the international market, as well as the export oriented garment industries of Bangladesh. More than 66 international brands have turned to Bangladesh in the last couple of years for importing denim products.

Exporting quality denim products worldwide can act as recovery after retailers have lost their confidence on the country following the tragic incidents and the image crisis in recent times.

Bangladesh's textile industry is going through a difficult time and performing below its capacity due to recent political turmoil and has recently started showing signs of recovery.

The state of the Company's affairs

Envoy Textiles Limited (ETL) is a 100% export oriented denim fabric manufacturer and the first denim project in Bangladesh with rope dyed technology having installed capacity of 50 million yards per year of which attainable capacity is around 80 to 85% of installed capacity. Out of total, 16 millions yards of newly installed capacity is in commercial operation from July 2014 and remaining 10 millions yards of installed capacity is still in trail production. ETL is specialized in 4.5 oz to 14.75 oz ring and open-end denim fabric. Company's core focus area is product development through research and innovation and its effort is to produce diverse range of denim fabrics to compete in the higher value added market segment.

The Company has started to set up its SPINNING project having a production capacity of 17,500 MT per year to have a vertical backward linkage. This will enable the Company to have a price competitiveness and shorter lead time in delivery, which is expected to come into operation from the first quarter of 2016. The total estimated project cost is USD 30 Million, out of the total estimated project cost, HSBC and BRAC Bank Ltd. have expressed their willingness to finance a total of USD 20 Million under offshore financing arrangement and rest of USD 10 Million will be provided from the Company's own source. The major capital machineries to be imported for setting up the project are primarily from Germany, Switzerland and Japan in origin. The production of yarn will mostly be used for the Company's own consumption and may also increase the yearly profit by BDT 40-45 crore approximately from expected turnover of USD 50 Million p.a. on completion of implementation of the spinning unit.

Risks and Concerns

The Company is aware of its following various risks and concerns and is prepared to meet those by systematic control:

Industry Market Risk-Bangladesh has to compete with other established manufacturers in countries like China, India, Pakistan, Cambodia and Vietnam. India and Pakistan are the two leading denim exporters that have become very lucrative to international buyers as the countries local currency devaluated against the dollar exchange rate. Besides, Pakistan recently is enjoying a GSP facility in the EU market. Due to the rising cost in China, buyers are already planning to move to other cost efficient destinations like Bangladesh. Moreover, Bangladesh Denim Textile Industry has a competitive advantage as we have a very developed garments infrastructure and continuously upgrading skills of human resources enabling us to bring out high quality and cost competitive products. Though, political instability is still quite certain industry risk for Bangladesh.

Demand Risk- The demand for denim products is not growing at the expected level, as the younger generation now are more fascinating with electronic gadgets rather than buying fashionable denim wears. Climate changes have a seasonal demand variation and it could have a significant impact in some years.

Financial Risk-Risk and uncertainties for use of estimates in preparation of financial statements has been disclosed under note 4.02 of the Financial Statements.

Raw Material Price Risk-Yarn price in the world market is volatile, since yarn price is directly correlated with cotton production. As the Company is operating in intermediary process such price fluctuation can be adjusted within a short lead period.

Foreign Exchange Risk-As payment for Raw Materials is set-off by realization from export proceeds in the same foreign currency. Foreign Exchange rate fluctuation risk is very minimal which is adjusted through natural hedge.

Operational Performance

Segment-wise

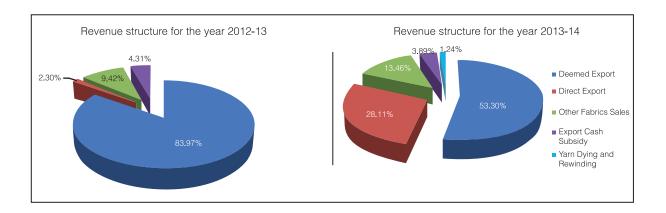
The Company has single product line, producing and exporting quality denim fabrics in diverse shade, quality, recipe, color, weight, fashion, etc to the different countries.

Revenue comes from different segment, core revenue sources of ETL are from deemed export through export oriented RMG against back to back LC and direct export selling of denim fabric to the world-renowned foreign buyer. The Company is receiving cash subsidy at the rate of five percent on export proceeds, subject to procuring raw materials from local source. There are also some turnover from weaving & finishing, B grade fabric sales, sample sales and stock fabric sales. We have newly introduced a fresh revenue segment by yarn dyeing and rewinding for local knit RMG. In the FY 2012-13, ETL's revenue was BDT 3,983.61 million, which has increased to around BDT 4,391.17 million in the FY 2013-14. Average revenue growth rate is 10.23% over the period from FY 2012-13 to FY 2013-14.



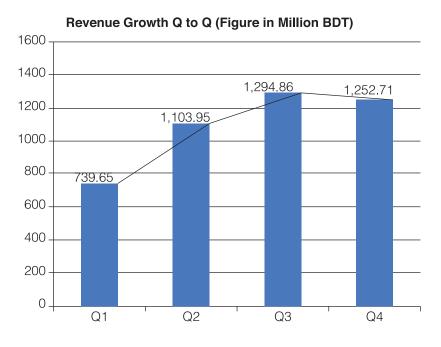

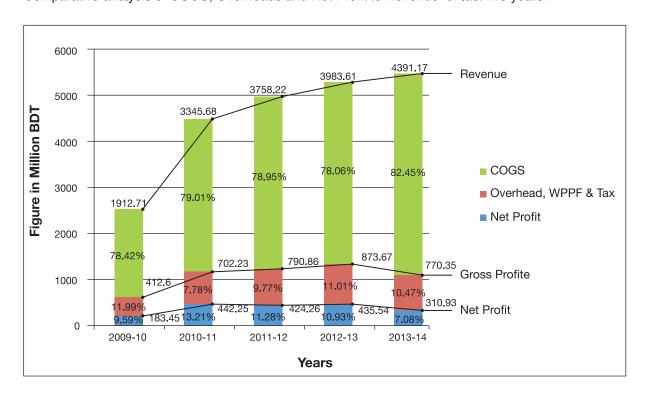
During the 1st quarter from October to December 2013, the demand status was very low as international buyers were reluctant to place order due to collapse of Rana Plaza and some other incidents relating to RMG. Moreover, due to political turmoil during that period, the buyers were not able to visit Bangladesh and worried about the execution of orders. Over the period of time, ETL had stretched its limits to overcome the situation, and now, the market has started to stabilize again and a prospect business growth improved substantially.



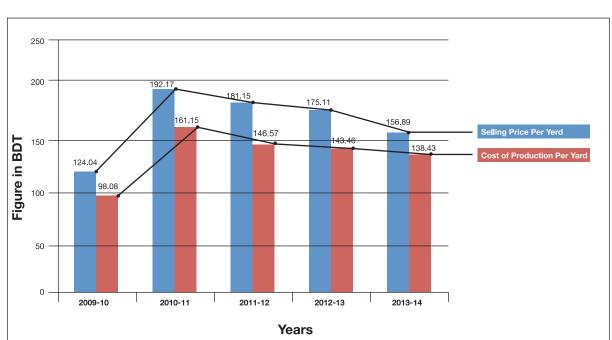

Average Selling price verses Cost of Production per yard for last five years:

As reflected in the above figure, average selling price per yard has fallen down by 10.40% and the cost of production per yard reduced by 3.50%, where the gross margin in net of negatively has had an impact of 6.90% only due to the fall of the fabrics selling price in the year 2013-14 as compared to the year 2012-13.

Due to political instability in recent past periods, the international buyers were not comfortable to place order in Bangladesh. This resulted in price cutting to attract the buyers. In addition to this, the slump of cotton price in the international market also further reduced the fabrics selling price.

Cost of Production per yard decreased as compared to the previous year mainly due to efficient raw materials sourcing, cotton price reduction in the international market and production efficiency through utilizing optimum production capacity.

Financial expenses increased significantly as investments made through new bank loans for the 2nd denim unit in capital machineries and infrastructure, and a considerable amount of Bank's credit facility utilized against additional working capital requirement for extended production capacity. For efficient raw material sourcing, we have availed low cost EDF fund instead of procuring raw materials through supplier's credit under deferred LC arrangement, the reason behind a significant amount of accounts payable for raw materials converted into short term bank liabilities, as well as interest accrued thereon. However, financial cost would efficiently be reduced in the following years as the company is availing low cost offshore fund substituting high cost local bank finance from the end of the reporting period.

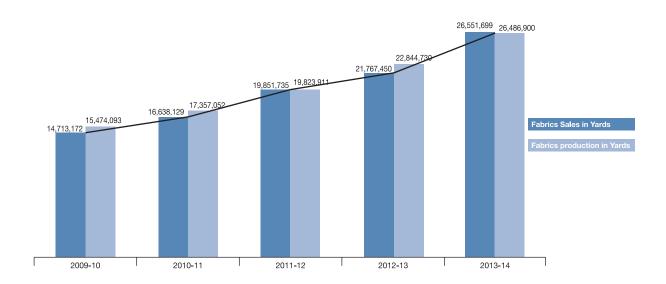
In spite of unfavorable business environment where survival was a big challenge, not only for your Company, but also for the Industry, the Company earned an acceptable net Profit after tax of BDT 310.925 million through professional management capacity, competitive raw material sourcing, extended production capacity, cost efficiency, collective marketing effort, product diversity and widening revenue segment.

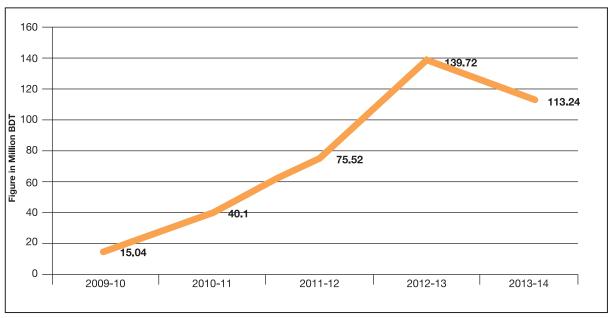

(Amount in Million BDT)

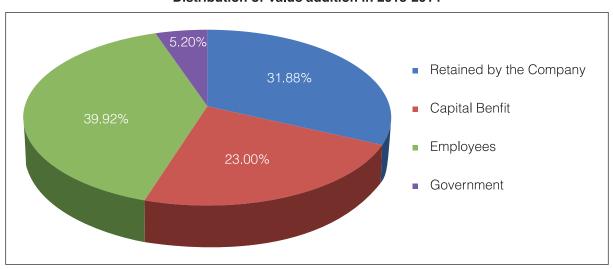

শিল্পের অবস্থান

বাংলাদেশের অর্থনীতিতে বস্ত্রশিল্পের অবদান অনস্বীকার্য, জিডিপিতে এ শিল্পের অবদান ১৫ শতাংশ এবং জাতীয় আয়ের ৫ শতাংশ এ শিল্প থেকে আসে, যেটি দেশের একটি উল্লেখযোগ্য জনগোষ্ঠীর কর্মসংস্থানের ব্যবস্থা নিশ্চিত করেছে।

দেশব্যাপি ২৫টি কারখানা থেকে উৎপাদিত প্রতি মাসে ৩০ মিলিয়ন গজের বেশী ডেনিম ফেব্রিক্সের অধিকাংশই রপ্তানীমূখী দেশীয় তৈরী পোশাক শিল্পের মাধ্যমে এবং বাকীটুকু সরাসরি রপ্তানী হয়ে থাকে। বিশ্বে ডেনিম ফেব্রিক্স উৎপাদনকারী ও রপ্তানীকারক দেশ হিসেবে বাংলাদেশের স্থান চতুর্থ অবস্থানে। ডেনিম পন্য রপ্তানীতে চীনের পরেই বাংলাদেশ বিশ্বের দ্বিতীয় সর্বোচ্চ স্থানে রয়েছে। বাংলাদেশ থেকে বছরে ১২০০ মিলিয়ন ডলারের বেশী ডেনিম উৎপাদিত পন্য রপ্তানী হয়ে থাকে।

গুনগত মান ও মূল্য সাশ্রয়ী হওয়াতে বাংলাদেশে উৎপাদিত ডেনিম ফেব্রিক্সের চাহিদা দিনে দিনে দেশীয় রপ্তানীমূখী তৈরী পোষাক শিল্প প্রতিষ্ঠানের নিকট ও আন্তর্জাতিক বাজারে ক্রমবর্ধমান হারে বৃদ্ধি পাচেছ। বিগত কয়েক বছরে কমপক্ষে ৬৬ টির বেশী আন্তর্জাতিক ব্র্যান্ডেড প্রতিষ্ঠান বাংলাদেশ থেকে ডেনিম পন্য আমদানিতে উৎসাহী হয়ে উঠেছে।

সাম্প্রতিক সময়ে ঘটে যাওয়া কিছু দূর্ভাগ্যজনক ঘটনায় আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতাদের নিকট যে আস্থার সংকট সৃষ্টি হয়েছে গুনগত মান সম্পন্ন ডেনিম পন্য রপ্তানীর মাধ্যমে তা পুনরুদ্ধার সম্ভব হতে পারে।

বর্তমানে বাংলাদেশের টেক্সটাইল্স শিল্প একটি কঠিন সময়ের মধ্য দিয়ে যাচ্ছে এবং পূর্ণমাত্রায় এর উৎপাদন সক্ষমতা ব্যবহৃত না হওয়ার জন্য রাজনৈতিক অচলাবস্থা বহুলাংশে দায়ী, যদিও সাম্প্রতিক সময়ে এই অচলাবস্থার কিছুটা উন্নতি সাধিত হয়েছে।

কোম্পানীর বিষয়াদির অবস্থা

এনভয় টেক্সটাইল্স লিমিটেড (ইটিএল) বার্ষিক ৫০ মিলিয়ন গজ উৎপাদন ক্ষমতা সম্পন্ন বাংলাদেশে স্থাপিত প্রথম রোপ ডাইয়িং প্রযুক্তির শতভাগ রপ্তানীমূখী ডেনিম ফেব্রিক্স উৎপাদনকারী একটি প্রতিষ্ঠান। যার প্রকৃত উৎপাদন ক্ষমতা স্থাপিত উৎপাদন ক্ষমতার ৮০-৮৫ শতাংশের কাছাকাছি। মোট স্থাপিত উৎপাদন ক্ষমতার মধ্যে, নতুন স্থাপিত ১৬ মিলিয়ন গজ উৎপাদন ক্ষমতার বাণিজ্যিক উৎপাদন জুলাই ২০১৪ থেকে শুক্র হয়েছে এবং বাকী ১০ মিলিয়ন গজের উৎপাদন ক্ষমতা এখনো পরীক্ষামূলক উৎপাদনে রয়েছে। এনভয় টেক্সটাইল্স লিমিটেড বিশেষ করে ৪.৫ থেকে ১৪.৭৫ আউসের ফেব্রিক্স উৎপাদন করে থাকে। কোম্পানীর মূল বিপণন লক্ষ্য হলো গবেষনা ও উদ্ভাবনের মাধ্যমে বিভিন্ন ধরনের ফেব্রিক্সের উৎকর্ষ সাধন করে উন্নত প্রতিযোগীশীল বাজারে নিজেদের অবস্থান তৈরী করা।

কোম্পানীর প্রধান কাঁচামাল– সূতা উৎপাদন ও যোগানের উদ্দেশ্যে বার্ষিক ১৭,৫০০ টন উৎপাদন ক্ষমতা সম্পন্ন একটি স্পিনিং প্রকল্পের কাজ ইতিমধ্যে শুরু করেছি। এটি মানসম্পন্ন, সাশ্রয়ী ও দ্রুততম সময়ে সূতার যোগান নিশ্চিত করবে। ২০১৬ সালের প্রথম প্রান্তিকে এই প্রকল্পের উৎপাদন কার্যক্রম শুরুর সম্ভাবনা রয়েছে। এটির মোট প্রকল্প ব্যায় প্রাক্তলন করা হয়েছে ৩০ মিলিয়ন মার্কিন ডলার যার দুই-তৃতীয়াংশ ব্যাংকের অর্থায়নে ও বাকী এক-তৃতীয়াংশ কোম্পানীর নিজস্ব তহবিল থেকে যোগান দেওয়া হবে। প্রকল্পটির উল্লেখযোগ্য মেশিনারীজ ও যন্ত্রাংশ জার্মানী, সুইজারল্যান্ড ও জাপান নির্মিত হবে। উৎপাদিত সূতার সিংহভাগ নিজস্ব প্রয়োজন মিটাতে ডেনিম ফেব্রিক্সের কাঁচামাল হিসেবে ব্যবহৃত হবে। প্রকল্পটি বাস্তবায়িত হলে সম্ভাব্য বার্ষিক ৫০ মিলিয়ন ডলার টার্নওভারের মাধ্যমে আনুমানিক ৪০-৪৫ কোটি টাকা অতিরিক্ত মুনাফা অর্জন করা সম্ভব হবে বলে আশা করা যায়।

বুঁকি ও এর অবস্থান:

কোম্পানী এর নিম্নোক্ত বিভিন্ন ঝুঁকির বিষয়ে সজাগ রয়েছে এবং এসব ঝুঁকি মোকাবিলায় প্রয়োজনীয় নিয়ন্ত্রনমূলক ব্যবস্থাধীনে আছে ঃ

শিল্পপণ্যের বাজারজনিত ঝুঁকি:

বাংলাদেশকে আন্তর্জাতিক বাজারে চীন, ভারত, পাকিস্তান, কম্বোডিয়া ও ভিয়েতনামের মতো প্রতিষ্ঠিত রপ্তানীকারক দেশগুলোর সাথে প্রতিযোগীতা করতে হয়। ইতিমধ্যে ভারত ও পাকিস্তানে ডলারের বিপরীতে দেশ দুটির স্থানীয় মুদ্রা অবমূল্যায়িত হওয়ায় আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতাদের নিকট এসব দেশ থেকে আমদানীকৃত ডেনিম পণ্যের মূল্য সাশ্রয় হচ্ছে। এছাড়াও পাকিস্তান অতি সাম্প্রতিক সময়ে ইউরোপীয় ইউনিয়নের বাজারে গুল্কমূক্ত পণ্য রপ্তানী সুবিধা পেয়েছে। অন্যদিকে চীনে ডেনিম পণ্যের উৎপাদন ব্যয় বৃদ্ধির ফলে আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতারা অন্যান্য মূল্য সাশ্রয়ী দেশের পাশাপাশি বাংলাদেশমূখী হচ্ছে। এছাড়া বাংলাদেশের একটি সমৃদ্ধ তৈরী পোষাক শিল্প রয়েছে এবং ধারাবাহিক মানবসম্পদ উন্নয়নের মাধ্যমে উন্নত মানের মূল্যসাশ্রয়ী পণ্য উৎপাদনে বাংলাদেশ ইতিমধ্যে সক্ষমতা অর্জন করেছে, যা বাজারঝুঁকি মোকাবিলায় একটি নিয়ামক শক্তি। যদিও, রাজনৈতিক অস্থিরতা এখনো বাজারের অন্যতম ঝুঁকি হিসেবে বিদ্যমান রয়েছে।

চাহিদাজনিত ঝুঁকি:

বর্তমানে বিশ্বের তরুন সমাজ পছন্দসই ডেনিম সামগ্রী ক্রয়ের পরিবর্তে অত্যাধুনিক যোগাযোগ-প্রযুক্তি পণ্যের দিকে অধিক ঝুকে পড়ায় ডেনিম পণ্যের আশান্বিত চাহিদার প্রবৃদ্ধি হচ্ছে না। এছাড়াও কোন কোন বছরে জলবায়ু পরিবর্তনের প্রভাবে সৃষ্ট ঋতু বৈচিত্রের তারতম্যে ডেনিম পণ্যের চাহিদা ব্যাপক ভাবে হ্রাস-বৃদ্ধি হতে পারে।

আর্থিক ঝুঁকি:

হিসাব বিবরণী যে সব অনুমানের মানদন্ডে প্রস্তুত করা হয়েছে, সে সব অনুমানজনিত ঝুঁকির বিষয়ে আর্থিক বিবরণীর পদটীকা ৪.০২ এ উল্লেখ করা হয়েছে।

কাঁচামালের মূল্য তারতম্যজনিত ঝুঁকি

যেহেতু ফেব্রিক্সের অন্যতম কাঁচামাল- সূতার উৎপাদন সরাসরি তুলা উৎপাদনের সাথে নির্ভরশীল এবং তুলা একটি কৃষিজাত পণ্য হওয়ায় এর মূল্য দ্রুত পরিবর্তনশীল। কোম্পানী ডেনিম পণ্য উৎপাদনের মধ্যবর্তী প্রক্রিয়ায় নিয়োজিত বিধায় কাঁচামালের মূল্য তারতম্যের দীর্ঘমেয়াদী কোন প্রভাব নেই।

বৈদেশিক মুদ্রার বিনিময়হারজনিত ঝুঁকি

যেহেতু সম বৈদেশিক মূদ্রায় কাঁচামালের ক্রয় মূল্য পরিশোধিত হয় পণ্যের রপ্তানী আয় থেকে, ফলে বৈদেশিক মুদ্রার বিনিময় হারের তারতম্য স্বাভাবিকভাবে সমন্বয় হয়ে যায় এবং এ ঝুঁকি খুবই নগন্য।

কোম্পানী বিভিন্ন প্রকারের শুধুমাত্র ডেনিম ফেব্রিক্সই উৎপাদন ও রপ্তানী করে থাকে।

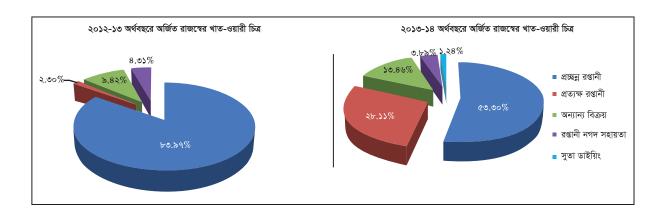
কোম্পানীর মুনাফা একাধিক খাত থেকে অর্জিত হয়। কোম্পানীর রাজস্বের প্রধান উৎস হলো ব্যাক টু ব্যাক এলসির বিপরীতে রপ্তানীমুখী স্থানীয় পোশাক শিল্পের মাধ্যমে প্রচ্ছন্ন রপ্তানী আয় এবং সরাসরি আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতাদের নিকট ফেব্রিক্স রপ্তানী হতে অর্জিত আয়।

এছাড়া কোম্পানী স্থানীয় উৎস হতে কাঁচামাল সংগ্রহের শর্তসাপেক্ষে রপ্তানী আয়ের উপর ৫ শতাংশ হারে নগদ সহায়তা পেয়ে থাকে। কোম্পানী রপ্তানী যোগ্য নয় এমন কিছু নিমুমানের ফেব্রিক্স ও স্যাম্পল ফেব্রিক্স ইত্যাদি বিক্রয় করে থাকে। সম্প্রতি আমরা স্থানীয় নীট পোশাক শিল্পের জন্য সূতা ডাইয়িং এর মাধ্যমে মুনাফা অর্জনের একটি নতুন খাত চালু করেছি। গত বছরের অর্জিত ৩,৯৮৩.৬১ মিলিয়ন টাকার টার্নওভারকে ছাড়িয়ে এ বছর সর্বমোট ৪,৩৯১.১৭ মিলিয়ন টাকার টার্নওভার অর্জিত হয়েছে, যা গত বছরের তুলনায় ১০.২৩ শতাংশ বেশী।

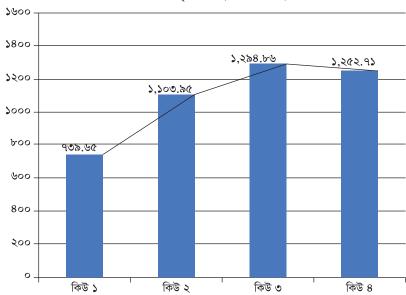

প্রান্তিক রাজস্ব আয় বৃদ্ধির হার (মিলিয়ন টাকায়)



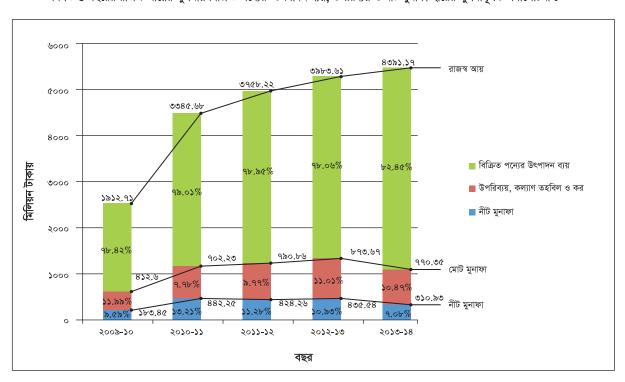
বছরের প্রথম প্রান্তিকে রানা প্লাজা ধস ও পোশাক শিল্পের সাথে সম্পর্কিত কিছু নেতিবাচক ঘটনার প্রেক্ষিতে আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতারা বাংলাদেশ থেকে পণ্য আমদানীতে নিরুৎসাহিত ছিল। এছাড়া, ঐ সময়ে চরম রাজনৈতিক অস্থিরতার কারণে আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতারা অর্ডার সরবরাহের নিশ্চয়তা নিয়ে শংকিত ছিল; যার ফলশ্রুতিতে চাহিদার অবস্থানের যথেষ্ট অবনতি হয়। সময়ের ব্যবধানে ইটিএল এ মন্দা অবস্থা থেকে উত্তরণ হতে সক্ষম হয়েছে এবং বর্তমানে বাজার আনেকটাই স্থিতিশীল, ভবিষ্যতে একটা সুদিনের আশা করা যায়।



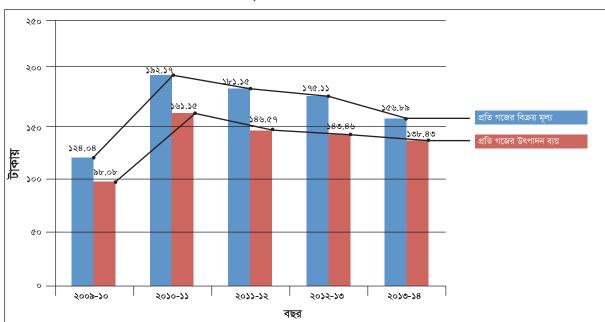

উপরের থাফে যেভাবে প্রতিফলিত হয়েছে , প্রতিগজ ফেব্রিক্সের বিক্রয় মূল্য ১০.৪০ শতাংশ হ্রাস পেয়েছে এবং অন্যদিকে প্রতিগজ ফেব্রিক্সের উৎপাদন ব্যয় হ্রাস পেয়েছে ৩.৫০ শতাংশ। যেখানে শুধুমাত্র ফেব্রিক্সের বিক্রয় মূল্য হ্রাসের ফলে গত বছরের মুনাফার তুলনায় এ বছরের মূনাফা ৬.৯০ শতাংশ কমে গেছে ।

বিগত সময়গুলোতে রাজনৈতিক অস্থিরতার কারণে আন্তর্জাতিক ক্রেতারা বাংলাদেশ থেকে পণ্য আমদানীতে সাচ্ছ্যন্দ বোধ করেনি। বিক্রয় মূল্যহ্রাসের মাধ্যমে মুনাফা ছাড় দিয়ে এ সব ক্রেতাদেরকে আকৃষ্ট করার চেষ্টা করা হয়েছিল। এছাড়াও, আন্তর্জাতিক বাজারে তুলার দরপতনের সাথে সামঞ্জস্য রেখে আরেক দফায় পণ্যের বিক্রয় মূল্যহাস করা হয়েছিল।

গত বছরের তুলনায় এ বছরের গজপ্রতি কাপড়ের উৎপাদন ব্যয় হ্রাসের পিছনে যুক্তি হলো- প্রতিযোগীতামূলক বাজার থেকে তাৎক্ষনিক পরিশোধ সাপেক্ষে সাশ্রয়ী দামে কাঁচামাল সংগ্রহ, আন্তর্জাতিক বাজারে তুলার দরপতন এবং উৎপাদন সক্ষমতা কাজে লাগানোর সুফল।

গত বছরের তুলনায় এ বছর ঋণ বাবদ বার্ষিক খরচ বৃদ্ধির কারণ হলো– এ বছর সম্প্রসারিত ডেনিম প্রকল্পের জন্য মেশিনারীজ আমদানীতে ও উৎপাদন অবকাঠামো নির্মাণে একটি উল্লেখযোগ্য পরিমান ব্যাংকের অর্থায়ন হয়েছে। সম্প্রসারিত উৎপাদনের জন্য ব্যাংক ঋণের মাধ্যমে অধিক পরিমান চলমান মূলধনের সংস্থান করা হয়েছে। কাঁচামাল সংগ্রহে মূল্যসাশ্রয়ের উদ্দেশ্যে বাকীতে ক্রয়ের পরিবর্তে স্বল্প সুদে EDF তহবিল থেকে ঋণ নিয়ে তাৎক্ষনিক মূল্য পরিশোধের ভিত্তিতে কাঁচামাল ক্রয় বাবদ গৃহীত ব্যাংক ঋণের সুদ। যার ফলে একটি উল্লেখযোগ্য বাকীতে ক্রয় বাবদ পাওনাদারের পরিমান স্বল্প মেয়াদী ব্যাংক ঋণে স্থানান্তরিত হয়েছে।

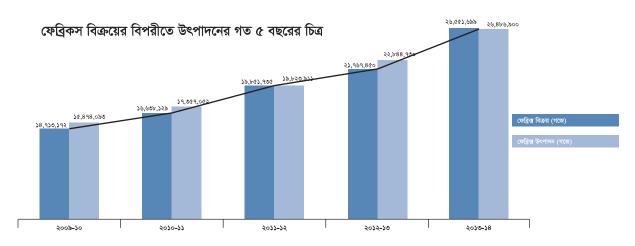
যদিও আগামীবছরে ঋণ বাবদ খরচের পরিমান অনেক কমে আসবে, যার কারণ হলো- এ বছরের শেষ প্রান্তিকে চড়া সুদে দেশীয় ব্যাংক হতে গৃহীত একটি বড় অংকের ঋণ স্বল্প সুদে গৃহীত বিদেশী ব্যাংক ঋণের সাথে সমন্বয় করা হয়েছে।

প্রতিকূল ব্যবসায়িক পরিবেশ বিরাজ করা স্বত্ত্বেও, যেখানে গোটা শিল্পের মুনাফা অর্জনের মাধ্যমে টিকে থাকাটা একটি কঠিন শংকার মধ্যে ছিল, কোম্পানী বিভিন্ন ব্যবসায়িক কৌশল প্রয়োগ করে যেমন, প্রতিযোগীতামূলক দরে কাঁচামাল সংগ্রহ, উৎপাদন ক্ষমতা বৃদ্ধি, ব্যয় সাশ্রয়, সম্মিলিত বিক্রয় উদ্যেগ, পণ্য বৈচিত্রায়ন, মুনাফার খাত বৃদ্ধি ইত্যাদি সহ এর সামগ্রীক ব্যবস্থাপনার সক্ষমতা ও দক্ষতাকে কাজে লাগিয়ে ৩১০.৯২৫ মিলিয়নের একটি গ্রহণযোগ্য মুনাফা অর্জনে সক্ষম হয়েছে।

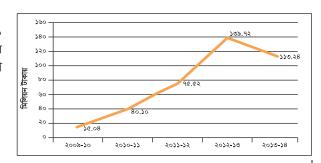

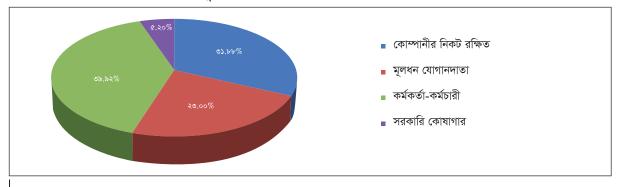

3.00 BASIS OF PREPARATION:

3.01 Statement of Compliance

- (i) Statement of Financial Position as at 30 September 2014.

3.06 Specific accounting policies selected and applied for significant transactions and events.

Property, Plant & Equipment

Property, Plant & Equipment comprises Factory Building, Rest House, Officer and Staff Quarter, Corporate Office Building, Factory Equipment, Furniture & Fixture, Machinery, ETP Cost, Office Equipment, Motor Vehicle, Software etc. Fixed assets are stated at their historical cost less accumulated depreciation. Land, building, other construction, machineries/equipments, ETP cost and office spaces measured and valued at fair value in compliance with Bangladesh Accounting Standards (BAS).

No depreciation has been charged on the Land and Land Development. Depreciation is charged on all other assets on reducing balance method. Depreciation has been charged on addition from the date of the related assets are ready for use. The rates of depreciation are as follows:

Revaluation of Fixed Assets

The fixed assets as on 30 June 2010 have been revalued at fair market value as per decision of the board of directors. All fixed assets under land, building, machineries and equipment available on the cut of date on 30 June 2010 were revalued by an independent valuation company named Asian Surveyors Limited. The revaluation of assets has been made at present market value of land, building, machinery and equipment allowing due depreciation on building, machinery and equipment for the month which has already been expired from the estimate total useful life.

Increase in the carrying amount arising on revaluation of land, building, machinery and equipment are credited to "Revaluation Surplus" under share holders equity.

Amount of depreciation on revaluation surplus has been credited to retained earnings by debiting revaluation surplus as per BAS-16: Property, Plant and Equipment.



3.07 Deferred Expenses

Pre-Operational expenses of the company are being considered as deferred expenses and are being amortized @ 10.00% per year on written down value.

3.08 Inventories and Stores

Inventories and stores are comprises of raw materials, raw materials in transit, packing materials, work in progress, finished goods, and spare & spare parts in transit. Inventories are valued at the lower of the cost and net realizable value.

3.09 Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and Cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, bank current accounts, other bank deposits free of encumbrance and having maturity date of three months or less from respective dates of deposit.

3.10 Statement of Cash Flows

Statement of Cash Flows is prepared principally in accordance with IAS 7 as adopted by ICAB as BAS 7 "Statement of Cash Flows" and the cash flows from the operating activities have been presented under direct method as prescribed by the Securities and Exchange Rules, 1987 and considering the provision of paragraph 19 of IAS 7 which provides that "enterprises are encouraged to report cash flows from operating activities using the direct method".

3.11 Taxation

The company is enjoying tax holiday for 4 (four) years commencing from March 01, 2008, under approval of National Board of Revenue (NBR) dated on September 09, 2008. The tax-holiday period of the company expired on February 29, 2012 and due provision for Income Tax has been maintained in the Income Statement. During the tax holiday period 40% of net profit of the company is transferred to the tax holiday reserve in proportionately to invest in the areas as specified by the income Tax Ordinance 1984. Income tax provision made after expiry of tax holiday period as per rate prevailing during that period.

3.12 Related Party Transactions

During the year the company has no related party transaction with its sister concern.



3.13 Revenue Recognition

Sales of Goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognized when all the following conditions are satisfied:

- The company has transferred to the buyer the significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods;
- The company retains neither continuing managerial involvement to the degree usually associated with ownership nor effective control over the goods sold;
- The amount of revenue can be measured reliably;
- It is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the company; and
- The cost incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably.

Other Income and Expenses:

It is recognized when received.

3.14 Foreign Currency Transactions

Transactions in Foreign Currencies are translated into BDT at the rate of exchange ruling on date of transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities expressed in foreign currencies are translated into BDT at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Gains or losses resulting from foreign currency transactions are taken to the income statement.

3.15 Borrowing Costs/Financial Expenses

Borrowing costs are recognized as expenses in the period in which they incurred and capitalized the same that incurred before commencement of commercial operation.

3.16 Earnings per Share

Basic Earnings per Share (EPS) has been computed dividing the earnings attributable to the weighted average number of the ordinary shares during the period. This has been calculated in compliance with the requirements of BAS-33: Earnings Per Share by dividing the basic earnings by the weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding during the year.

Basic Earnings

This represents earnings for the year attributable to ordinary shareholders. As there was no preference dividend, minority interest or extra ordinary items, the net profit after tax for the year has been considered as fully attributable to the ordinary shareholders.

3.17 Workers Profit Participation Fund (WPPF)

The company has charged @ 5.00% of net profit to workers profit participation fund for the year 2013-14.



3.18 Financial Instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognized on the balance sheet when the company has become a party to a contractual provision of the instrument:

Accounts Receivables

Accounts Receivables are stated at their nominal value and considered good. No provision has been made for doubtful debt and no amount was written off as bad.

Accounts Payables

Accounts Payables are stated at their nominal value.

Due to/Due from Related Parties

Due to /due from related parties are stated at nominal value.

Borrowings/Secured Loan

Interest bearing bank loans and overdrafts are recorded at the proceeds received. Finance charges are accounted for on an accrual basis.

3.19 Declaration of Dividend:

The Board has declared Dividend @ 15% on paid up capital based on the financial year ended on September 30, 2014 as per decision of the Board of Directors in their meeting held on 19th November 2014.

4.00 Additional Information

4.01 Responsibility for preparation and presentation of Financial Statements

The Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation and presentation of Financial Statements under Section 183 of the Companies Act, 1994 and as per the provision of "the framework for the preparation and presentation of financial statements" issued by the International Accounting Standards Committee (IASC).

4.02 Risk and uncertainties for use of estimates in preparation of financial statements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the International Accounting Standards requires management to make estimates and assumption that affect the report, amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and revenue and expenses during the period reported. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates are used for accounting of certain terms such as long term contracts, provision for doubtful accounts, depreciation and amortization, employees benefit plans, taxes reserves and contingencies.



4.03 Reporting Currency and level of precision

The figures in the financial statements represent Bangladesh currency (Taka), which have been rounded off to the nearest integer.

4.04 Comparative Information

Comparative figures (previous year's) and account titles in the financial statements have been rearranged/ restated where necessary to conform to the changes in presentation in the current year.

4.05 Commission

Commission/Bonus has been paid to sales agents during the period under audit.

4.06 Brokerage or Discount

No brokerage was paid against sales during the year under audit.

4.07 Board Meeting & Board Members

There were 8 members in the Board of Directors of the Company and 15 Board Meetings were held in the period under review.

4.08 Acknowledgement of Claims

There no claim against the company not acknowledged as debt at the date of Financial Position.

4.09 Going Concern

The company has adequate resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future. For this reason the directors continue to adopt going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

4.10 Period of Financial Statements

Period of financial statements is from 01 October 2013 to 30 September 2014.
